
## Courage to be Faithful and Bold! Pastor's Desk – Sunday, March 11, 2018

Many of our young couples, youth and now even our children are under constant pressure to assimilate the prevailing culture and mentality out there today. I've heard of brothers and sisters who were threatened by people above them in the work place, for refusing to go with the culture of the day! Instead, you must worship Christ as Lord of your life. And if someone asks about your hope as a believer, always be ready to explain it."
