
Not Guilty!

One of the worst things in life is to walk around carrying a heavy load of guilt. Most of the time, God doesn't even remember it anymore. I've learned over the years, that the quickest way to defeatism is to walk around feeling guilty, when God has already forgiven us! The Scriptures clearly say: "There is, therefore, now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of Life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death." - Romans 8:1-2 — On the moment that we came to God through Christ Jesus, there remains no more guilt against us! (Acts 2:38).
