
Patience Like This is Unheard Of! Pastor's Desk – November 18, 2018



One of the greatest disfavors we can bestow upon ourselves is to have a torn heart with bitterness! Bitterness will cause us to become dull and senseless in our hearts! The Psalmist Asaph expressed that in Psa 73:21-22, "When I was beleaguered and bitter, totally consumed by envy, I was totally ignorant, a dumb ox in your very presence." (MSG) That's quite a statement coming from someone whose life was entirely dedicated to praise and worship our God! Yet, this tells me that even those of us who strive to be closer to God on a daily basis are not immune to these plagues called bitterness and envy!!! Bitterness and envy will lead people to act as "dumb oxen." Sadly enough, many fall victim to this horrible condition.
