
The Waiting Strategy

Isaiah 40:31: "But those who wait on the LORD Shall renew their strength..."

Some will probably read this verse with a lost heart and content with giving up in despair. It seems God had forgotten to be gracious and, in anger, had shut up His tender mercies. To such, Isaiah declares: God is not tired: you suspect He is because you are. But instructions are clear: "Wait on the Lord!"

The question is not about changing your environment but your courage, endurance, and confidence in winning. Despite obstacles, "...They shall mount up with wings like eagles, They shall run and not be weary, They shall walk and not faint."

The unavoidable order is mounting up - running - walking! We assume that the journey begins with walking, then running, then flying with wings like an eagle. However, in reality, experience proves that this prophetic order is accurate! We mount, we run, we walk!

And let's fulfill this promise. "those who wait on the LORD Shall renew their strength." We rely too much on external spurs to reignite our passion.
