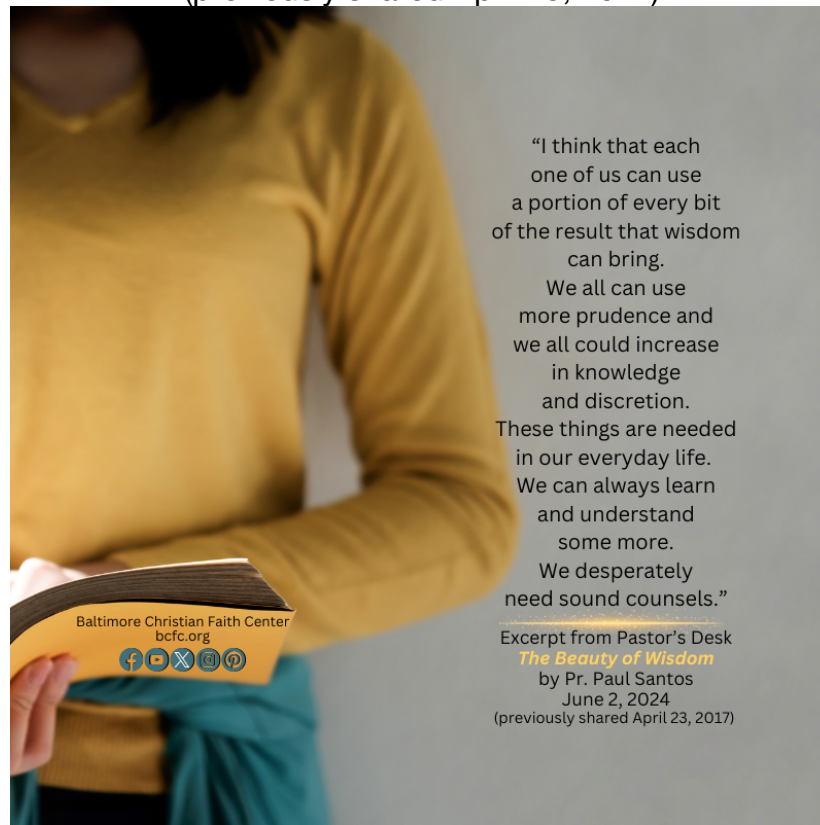


The Beauty of Wisdom
