
RESTORATION

Hosea 14:2-4 "2 Take words with you, And return to the LORD. Say to Him, "Take away all iniquity; Receive us graciously, For we will offer the sacrifices of our lips. **3** Assyria shall not save us, We will not ride on horses, Nor will we say anymore to the work of our hands, 'You are our gods.' For in You the fatherless finds mercy." **4** "I will heal their backsliding, I will love them freely, For My anger has turned away from him."

The fallen are despised by the world and do not believe in the possibility of total rehabilitation—the prisoner who was once an honored entrepreneur; the beautiful woman under the degrading impact of drugs or alcohol; the minister or physician who has suffered disgrace and shame—all such find it difficult to be reinstated. Consequently, that's how our Lord dealt with Peter. The Lord Jesus knew that despite his unfortunate fall, there was a powerful undercurrent of sincere love, and He did not hesitate to entrust the care of His sheep and lambs to him.
