Every believer has a unique role to play in the body of Christ. There are assignments given by Christ through the Holy Spirit to every believer for the common good of the body of Christ. We read in Exodus 28:3 the following words, "And you shall speak to all the skillful persons whom I have endowed with the Spirit of Wisdom, that they make Aaron's garments to consecrate him that he may minister as priest to Me." In this passage, we find that Aaron and His sons were called to be priests to God Himself, not to Israel. And because of the nature of His calling, Aaron was supposed to dress in a special manner, "holy garments for glory and beauty."
